VALE Carl Ryves 13 October 2022

Carl Ryves was a fierce competitor in many forms of sailing including competing in Fying Dutchman at the 1968 Olympics in Mexico with Dick Sargeant. They finished 4th Overall (just 0.7 points out of medal contention). Carl was involved with several Americas Cup campaigns and named Australian Sailing Yachtsman of the Year in 1968–69. Many in the Dragon fraternity know Carl from his time competing in Dragons on Sydney Harbour, most recently on 'Sidewinder', which is now sailing on in Metung.

Fiona was an excellent raconteur, illustrating her points with a wealth of stories from her practical background as a paramedic.

The PCR and defibrillator practical sessions greatly increased our confidence in responding to cardiac problems. I was certainly surprised by how First Aid advice had changed since I last did a First Aid course (during the last ice-age) and how much more focus was placed on shock, diabetes and asthma. The Club would hope that this would be just the first of these courses and that skippers and crew might want to be part of a future course.

Attendees were: Peter Wilkinson, Peter Bull, Ann Waller, Ian Crooke, Amanda Hack, Jan McChesney, Nathan Moresi and Rod Edwards, with Hugh Howard and Derek Russell as the club safety officers. The general first aid course material should be updated with a refresher every three years but the PCR part every year and Tim Brown took advantage of the course to do that update.

HERE'S A BLAST FROM THE PAST...

How many of you would have been in Metung for the inaugural issue of the METUNG PELICAN? Do I hear you ask what on earth is the Metung Pelican?? It was a quarterly community newspaper, first published in January 1980, and the first edition retailed for 20c. Thanks to the generosity of a keen archivist, below are a few snippets from that first edition...

AROUND THE CORNER AGA

Years ago, it used to be said that you couldn't be properly regarded as a Metung inhabitant until you have lived in Metung for 10 years; fallen off your own boat at the Main Jetty, outside the Pub in full view; and fallen off your own Jetty, wherever it was and had to swim ashore. Newcomer to the Village just about achieved the lot. Stepped off the Main Jetty onto a foot rail which wasn't there, clasping large box of groceries, and went straight in, missing his yacht by about two feet. Bloke and groceries came ashore a few minutes later. Bloke was O.K. but labels on canned food came off. There were some very curious dishes as a result. Ever tried frying what you thought to be tinned Mushrooms which turned out to be tinned Pears?

The view from the Metung Pub always offers a variety of attractions and amusements. Local cruisers with Mum and Dad on board. Dad at the wheel and Mum untying the mooring lines. Dad yells "Cast Off" and guns the engines as Mum undoes the Bowline. Mum has either forgotten to untie the Stern line or is wrestling with the horrible knots which Dad has tied and wishing she had a kitchen knife to cut ropes or Dad's throat. Meanwhile, full bore forward Cruiser goes no-where. So Dad comes back, goes to Pub all nonchalently and buys another 2 doz. cold cans. Goes back to boat pretending that nothing has happened and tries to take off again. Mum has untied Stern line in readiness for Dad's return and Cruiser is now floating three yards off the Main Jetty. Dad throws cans on board, tries to jump on and misses. We wonder how the holiday finished? Local new trawler and new deck hand entertained us recently in a similar manner. Seven attempts to berth at the Main Jetty. First time, deck hand skilfully looped rope over bollard at main Jetty only to find out that rope wasn't tied to boat. - and, he had already jumped off onto jetty. Boat returned to pick up red-faced deck hand. This time, he forgot to take bow line back with him so, another circle was made by the boat. This time he jumped off and grabbed the bow line but failed to make fast so ran aft and threw the rope over the stern line which was tied to deck rail. Deck rail took a severe lurch to starboard and nearly came adrift. Angry skipper pushed deck-hand onto ietty and was then left with no mooring ropes and no deck-hand. Clever to watch skipper bring boat in again using wind and tide, pick up ropes and make fast. Don't think we'll see deck-hand again in Metung.
